Allie Frankfurt to Address "The Journey" for Sisters at Heart Tuesday

Oklahoma City author Allie Frankfurt will speak at the area-wide gathering of women Tuesday, Feb. 27, at 6:30 p.m. when Sisters at Heart convenes for another monthly supper and inspirational program. Women and girls together will dine, listen and laugh during the evening at Wesley United Methodist Church, 302 E. Independence.

Mrs. Frankfurt and her husband, Ed, have a ministry of encouragement called *EnTheos*. Her topic, "The Journey," will include questions for the group about the race each is caught up in, and of whose choosing? Maybe you feel like you are all alone and sometimes lost? She asks, when the Bible talks about finishing well "the race laid before you"...do you wonder how you'll limp into the weekend?

Allie loves to talk about how only God could take the hardships of life-threatening illness, divorce, single-parenting, teenage rebellion, new marriage and retirement to a new state, cover them with His Grace and use them to create the blessed life she is living today.

She invites her listeners to be comforted in knowing that they are surrounded by the "Cloud of Witnesses" who have gone before them. With humor and candor, Allie will share a few miles of her own journey including the speed bumps that took her places she never planned to go.

Sisters at Heart draws women of all faiths together for motivational programs by authors, musicians and speakers, along with a snack supper and some conversational games and door prizes. Coordinators are Debbie Chlouber and Donna Tonubbee, elementary school teachers and active family ministry leaders at Wesley.

Meals are provided by participants taking turns bringing in covered dishes. There is no charge, although donations are welcomed to cover speaker gratuities. The evening meal and social time, along with devotions and programs have encouraged new friendships each month between the 60-70 women who generally attend, bringing along their mothers, daughters and neighbors.

A nursery is provided at no charge. Door prizes and samples of the *En Theos* gift items created by the Frankfurts will add to the evenings entertainment. Supper will begin at 6:30 p.m. with the program at 7 p.m.
